Grade 1-2 News:

The Grade 1/2 class is enjoying their new Science unit about position and motion. We have been talking about force, friction, and simple machines like inclined planes. It was fun to explore with different objects to see what would roll down an inclined plane. We also tested to see how the slope affects the distance an object will travel.







We are also enjoying listening and doing a variety of activities with fairy tales. We have used Venn Diagrams to compare different versions of the story, and wrote about different ways we could disguise the wolf from Little Red Riding Hood. We even had a couple of grade two reading groups perform the plays The Three Little Pigs and Little Red Riding Hood to the class. We can't wait to see which fairy tale we will be working on next!









Grade 3-4 Ms. Poirier News:

Our class has been busy learning about the history of Manitoba in social studies. This month we focused on Metis culture and their impact on our province. Each student chose one specific topic of Metis culture to focus on (such as food, clothing, dance, etc.) to create an individual quilt square. We then put all of these squares together to form a classroom quilt. This quilt is special because not only does it represent Metis culture but it also represents the diversity within our classroom in how each student chose to show their learning!


Grade 5/6 MYSTERY UNIT
















Grade 5-6 Mrs. Rody News:
