

# **Terry Fox Run Grade 4-5**





Over 24 incredible years, Balmoral School has done much to carry on Terry's dream of a world without cancer. To date, your school community has raised \$19,849.35 for cancer research in Terry's name.

### Grade 4-5 news:



Our class has been learning about the four quadrants of the Circle of Courage and its importance in our daily lives. Belonging, Independence, Mastery, and Generosity are the four quadrants that complete each and every one of us. When our circle is complete, we experience harmony. However, when our circles are incomplete, we experience the opposite. We learned about each quadrant separately and discussed how each would make us feel. Once all four quadrants were complete, we created our Respect Agreement for the school year!

Students wrote down what feelings they have when they experience Belonging. We then used those words to create a Wordle.





The final result of our Circle of Courage that includes all Wordle's of the feelings we experience when we experience belonging, independence, mastery, and generosity.

Students worked together in small groups to write down what they think is important to include on our Respect Agreement in each quadrant.



#### Honoring Truth and Reconciliation Week at Balmoral School

This year, students at Balmoral School took part in a variety of activities during the week leading up to the National Day for Truth and Reconciliation on September 30<sup>th</sup>. Each class-



room had discussions about Residential Schools which lead to each student creating an orange heart that highlighted what they imagine it would have felt like if they had to attend such a school. These hearts were our way of honouring the memories of sur-

vivors and those who didn't make it home. Students then had discussions about reconciliation and what it means. They each created a flower that showcased what hopes or dreams students have for future generations and the treatment of all people, regardless of their background. On Wednesday, September 29<sup>th</sup> Balmoral School had their Orange Shirt Day. We also took a moment of silence to honour survivors and reconciliation.


Our 'Honouring Memories' bulletin board with messages on how students imagine it would have felt to attend a Residential School.

# Student Vote






