The students were surprised to find that a whole bunch of bears had taken over their classroom. We used the bears to sort them into groups such as bears with bow ties and without bow ties, real bears and pretend bears, and white bears and bears that are not white. It was so much fun picking one bear to work with and then putting those bears in order from largest to smallest. The students also measured the length of some paper bear paws using digis. We even took the opportunity to have a Teddy Bear picnic in the gym.

Students get to practice their problem-solving skills and must persevere in order to succeed. I'm glad to report that all four groups were able to open their locked boxes. Way to go!

Ms. Poirier Grade 4/5 classroom



They made estimations, comparisons, and worked to measure different length points on their pumpkin as well as its circumference. We ended October by completing a Math Mystery: Case of the Jumpy Jack-O-Lanterns and carved our pumpkins!




