Bag it up Campaign



We have opened our paint centre and hope you are excited to see your student's painting creations. We also have a winter village as part of our dramatic play during centres.








Grade 1-2 Mrs. Buchan

Grade 4-5 news Ms. Poirier



This month, our class started using our Thrival Kits! Just as we often carry first aid kits to help with physical injuries, we also need kits to assist with our mental health, too. These kits were created to offer students with a variety of tools to aid in mental wellbeing. Over a variety of themes and activities, students will learn to become more self aware of their mental wellbeing in order to help provide them with coping strategies that will be helpful throughout their life. Our first theme has been "Understanding the Importance of Mental Health". To start, students created their own kits using blue shoe boxes and decorated them to express themselves. Their kits are for their eyes only and at the end of the year will contain a variety of tools that they can use for their mental wellbeing. Through activities, students have practiced mindful eating, mindful breathing, and body scan exercises. These activities were meant to be simple yet effective everyday mental health promotion activities that students can use anywhere. Each student also received their own journal so that they can keep track of any of their thoughts during our lessons as well as reflect on life experiences. As we continue working through our Thrival kits throughout the school year, we will cover five major themes:

- 1.Respecting Yourself and Others
- 2. Empowering Yourself with Knowledge of Your Human Rights
 - 3. Celebrating My Gifts, Talents, and Strengths
- 4. Feeling Grateful for the Present and Planting Dreams for the Future
 - 5. Living Mindfully





Grade 7-8 Mr. McLean



It has been a busy couple of months since the start of school in September. This report is long overdue, but we are excited to share all of the great things the students in Grade 7 & 8 have been doing all these months.

Project: Every Child Matters - Everybody Needs a Rock:

Students painted messages of hope and remembrance of the tragedies that occurred at residential schools and that Every Child Matter after reviewing the book "Everybody Needs a Rock". Students took their rocks home and placed them somewhere in their yard.

Project: Order of Operations Digital Escape Math:

Students using iPad, google slides, and google forms, participated in a fun math escape game. The game involves students solving a series of puzzle based on math concept they are learning. This game was based on order of operations.

Project: Day of the Dead - Remember our Ancestors:

Students created many different projects that allowed them to learn about the holiday called "dia de los Muertos" - known as the Day of the Dead. A celebration of family and ancestors. The students painted paper mache masks, decorated skull cookies, created calavera poetry, and created a special presentation of one of their ancestors and shared their stories with the class. The students presented these stories to the class and celebrated their ancestors by taking home marigold flower seeds to plant at home.

Project: Vimy Ridge & The Story of Vimy Oaks:

Students did a research project involving the battle of Vimy Ridge and the resulting development of Vimy Oaks in Ontario by a veteran of the Vimy Ridge battle. The students learned about the battle through a 360-degree tour through the CBC News Network.

Project: 100 Years of the Poppy:

Students used a story called "The Red Poppy" to spark this unit, and each student created a found poetry project that provides an impactful summary of the story. As well, students created an artistic poppy picture designed in a stained-glass effect.


It has been a great start of the year, and I hope to have more to share in the upcoming months.


