#### **Isolation Requirements**

#### For Positive Cases

Public health orders require Manitobans to isolate if they have tested positive for COVID-19 either through PCR or rapid antigen testing.

- An asymptomatic, <u>fully vaccinated</u> individual who tests positive is required to isolate for five days from the date of their positive test. A medical mask must be worn in public for an additional five days.
- A symptomatic, <u>fully vaccinated</u> individual who tested positive is required to isolate for five days since the date symptoms started appearing or the date of the test, whichever is later. They may end isolation after five days as long as their symptoms are improving and they do not have a fever. A medical mask must be worn in public for an additional 5 days.
- Individuals who are <u>not fully vaccinated</u> are required to isolate for 10 days after the date of their test. They may end isolation after 10 days as long as their symptoms are improving and they do not have a fever.
- Anyone with symptoms of COVID-19 who chooses not to be tested should consider themselves a case, and isolate and notify their close contacts.

Staff and students who suspect they have COVID-19, are required to follow public health isolation protocols and are strongly encouraged to notify the school and close contacts outside the school setting.
