## ELK Adventure in he Grade 7 \& 8 Math Class

Recently the grade 7 \& 8 were luckly enough to take on the challenge of scoring elk antler thanks to a great presentation from the Farmer family who own Stonewood Elk Ranch in Balmoral, MB. In align with our ISD divisional goals and school goals, we are always striving to make math learning authentic and relevant, and this was a great opportunity for the students to see how math has practical application.

To start off, students learned about how the Elk antlers have many different purposes from scientific research, medicine, and dog chews. The elk shed their antler every year.

At that point, Kelly, Trevor and Kate Farmer explained how to score the Elk antler, with the students learning the different parts of the antler and how to determine the correct side. The students also learned how to measure and record each measurement on an official form that is used at the Stonewood Elk Ranch.

The students measured the antler at different points recording their measurements in fractions, as each measurement must be recorded in regards to an $8^{\text {th }}$ of inch. The students were challenged with measuring three different sets of antlers. Each having a different role at each station. The students learned quick that the antlers are quite large and take a pair of hands to hold them in place while measuring. The students were then shocked to find out from the Farmer family that when they are measuring the elk on the farm, they have to measure them while they are still attached to the elk.

The students scored three different pairs of antlers recording their results on the official form, which at the end of the three stations were compared to see how close the students got to the official measurement. One group did really well, some measurements were within $3 / 8^{\text {th }}$ of inch of the actual.

The students really enjoyed the activity and many found it a very fun and exciting challenging math task. A big thank you to the Kelly, Trevor and Kate Farmer for presenting and teaching us a new skill in math!


During the two weeks of the Winter Olympics, the grade 7 \& 8 participate in their own gym class "winter olympics". Each group of students selected a country to represent in a variety of sports, competing for the gold, silver and bronze medals. It was a great activity, and also included the students learning about the science behind many of the winter Olympics sports and learning about the country they selected. It was a lot of fun and here a few of our medal winners and events.
