


Cross Country

Leading up to Truth and Reconciliation Day, students learned about and discussed Residential Schools. We discussed their impact and how we can work to show reconciliation. Students had the chance to choose four rocks of their liking and paint them. They then wrote kind, encouraging messages on each one. Once all students are finished, we will take a community walk and place these rocks where we think people might see them. This is our small gesture to show that we care about those around us. Our hope is that our rocks will brighten someone's day!



We have spent time learning about the Circle of Courage and how all four quadrants (Generosity, Belonging, Mastery, and Independence) work in our lives. When we have all four quadrants in sync, our circle is complete. When we have one or more quadrants out of sync, it throws off the harmony and we have to work to bring our circle back to balance. Students have shared ways they show each trait and how each trait makes them feel. We have also learned the various ways the Circle of Courage in related to Indigenous cultures and what else the four quadrants represent. We are currently working on creating our Respect Agreement based on the four quadrants.

We also have the pleasure of welcoming Brenda Margetts into our room to do an activity called, "What's in my Pocket?". Mrs. Margetts places an object in her pocket and provides students with 10 different clues. Using those clues and their inquiry skills, students try to determine what is in her pocket! The first object was arrowheads. Students had a chance to create their own arrowhead, choosing traits that best represented them. They then had a chance to research answers to their own questions. Students learned more about how arrowheads are made, if they are still used today, what arrowheads were used for in the past, and where they can be found. We cannot wait to see what is in her pocket in October!


Reminder: Book Fair is Coming!
