




### Mrs. Buchan's K/1 news:

## Miss Poirier's news:

In science right now, we are learning about states of matter and their interactions. We have been able to do lots of experiments to see how solids and liquids interact with each other. We were able to partner up with the Grade 5/6 class this month to complete an experiment together where students created oobleck (corn starch mixed with water). Students then completed some research to learn about what makes oobleck's properties so unique. Students learned that oobleck is called a colloid, which means that the state of the oobleck changes based on the pressure applied. While playing with their oobleck, students noticed that when they applied pressure, the oobleck would be solid but when they took that pressure away, the oobleck became liquid. So fascinating!




