- 5. Teacher/Faculty Report: Grade 1/2 room Kaleigh Poirier
  - Novel study- Where the Red Fern Grows
  - Math- fractions and decimals

  - Destination Imagination- tournament is in 2 weeks. 4 teams involved. The students have raised money for the supplies needed through a bake sale. She asked if PAC would be willing to cover the cost of the tournament fees of \$250.
     Cindy put forth a motion to have PAC cover the \$250. Tiffany seconded. Motion carried.

- Looking to bring Indigenous perspectives into the classroom, possibly creating drums. Tiffany, Cindy, and Bekki all have suggestions of possible contacts to look for elders or others that could come and facilitate some workshops.

## 6. Old Business:

- -Babysitting Course- we need to have a certain number of students to run the course. Instructor charges \$45 per student. PAC would need to go through the division to hire a division employee to be at the school to supervise, as well as cover the cost of having this employee. Students have to be 11 years old or older to participate. Bekki will send out a google form for families in our community to sign up. After, Tiffany made a motion to pay Community Use of Schools fee for a future date to have the course, up to \$80.00. Cindy seconded. Motion carried. More info to follow.
- -Scoreboard update- Mark talked to maintenance, and moving the projector would cost a lot. However, moving the screen does not cost very much. Bekki reported that we will factor in all costs for students who register, however would like to keep the cost as low as possible for families.
- -Change rooms- one is now usable, the other is still used for storage. Until the school can get a garage built, there is no place for storage, and the one change room will continue to be used for storage.

## 7. New Business:

-Fundraisers- the group discusses some options for fundraisers ideas: local honey, Purdy's chocolates, Bud, spud, and steak at the Rock, World's Finest. Committee decided we will try Purdey's. Bekki will talk to Allison to get the details and Tiffany and Cindy will help. Tentative date of fundraiser would be April 17-28, with chocolate arriving before mother's day.

\*\*\*\*\*Post meeting Update- Purdy's was not an option for fundraising at this time. Bekki emailed committee members and we decided on Kernels Popcorn. A letter and order form was sent to families, orders due March 24 before the break. Popcorn will be ready around April 21.
