Letter P was for panda. We learned about rare animals, and what makes a panda a mammal.


In science, we completed our mold experiment. We rubbed slices of bread on a variety of surfaces around the school to see which had the most germs.

We can't wait to learn more in the next 100 days of school!






Owl Fact- "Owls can only turn their heads 270 degrees."- Kohen Joyce




