It is a day where communities across the country and across the world can unite in celebrating diversity and raising awareness against bullying.




"I Love To Read Month"

Mrs. Loehmer's Kindergarten - Grade 1 Classroom News


In March, the K/1 class had a lot of things to do and learn.
