The following describes next year's classroom configurations:


Kindergarten/Grade One (K on Days 2, 4, 6) Grade Two/Grade Three Grade Four/Grade Five Grade Six/Grade Seven Grade Seven/Grade eight

For **2023-2024** the grade 7's will be split into different classrooms. Decisions are based on the number of students, social dynamics between students, siblings, students learning styles, behavioural needs of students in each classroom, emotional needs of students in each classroom, and the general needs for the group.

In the past, parents have asked if high academic achieving students will be placed with a higher grade. This is not the case. Decisions about which classroom where students end up are **not** made based on student achievement. There are many benefits of being with a higher and lower grade.



Art or Band option

Just a reminder that students in grade 5-8 in the fall have the option of band or art. If a student took art or band in the past they may still switch for the upcoming year. Forms need to be signed and returned ASAP.

Volunteer information

For the **2023-2024** school year if you are looking to volunteer in any capacity at the school you will be required to complete a criminal records check, child abuse registry, confidentiality letter and volunteer agreement form. You are also required to complete Respect in Schools training on line and return a copy of the certificate to school.

Please contact the school and we can send home a package with your child/(ren) or drop in to pick one up. There is no fee if you are volunteering and we have a letter to attach with the documents. In the instructions the criminal records check can now be emailed. Packages may be picked up at school and the child abuse registry is to be returned to the office so that we may process it.

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Balmoral School Drum Making Experience

On Friday June 9, students in Grades 6 and 7 had the opportunity to participate in a traditional Indigenous drum making experience with Mark Hall from Anish Corporation. Mark is a cultural support worker who brings experiences to youth in order to keep traditional Indigenous learnings alive. This morning, he led students through the process of drum making using Elk hides. He taught students the significance of Indigenous traditions including smudging, honouring the four directions, and offering tobacco to Mother Earth. This was an incredible experience and we are thankful Mark was able to offer this to our students!





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Proposed End of Day Changes

The end of day has looked different over the years for Balmoral School. Previously, pick-ups were done before and during bus loading. Having parents and students spread out during COVID while in the bus loop area was hazardous, so families were asked to wait until the buses had left before pick -ups occurred.

Some folks have requested an earlier pick-up time (e.g. not having to wait for the buses to arrive and leave). This has been identified to help folks make it on time to after school events such as skating, hockey, piano and dance.

For the 2023-2024 Balmoral School year, the school is looking at changes to the day's timeline for breaks and dismissals. The schedule would then align more with other elementary and middle schools in Interlake School Division.

3:30pm – Daycare dismissed

3:30pm – Town students dismissed

3:30pm – Pick-up students dismissed

3:55pm – Bus Loading & Departure

Please Note That:

- These changes would allow for town/ pick-up students to be away from the building earlier.
- These changes would allow for the bus loop to be clear of families picking up students, before buses from Stonewall arrive.
- These changes would allow time for the town students to be safely away from the building before buses from Stonewall arrive.
- These changes would not impact the amount of time students spend in class.
- These changes would allow for an increase in time allotted for support staff during academic classes.
- Daycare is aware of theses proposed changes.

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Bike Safety

Balmoral can be a dangerous place to walk and bike. In particular, Hwy 236 can be dangerous for folks having to bike/walk along side it or for folks having to cross it multiple times.

The school wants to do what it can to work with families to ensure safety. Please keep in mind the following information and best practices in mind when planning safe routes home for students:

- Early years students should be accompanied by an adult or an older student.
- Students are encouraged to use the buddy system or to go with a group
- Having an adult or older student join the group
- Map out and use safe routes home
- Create safety plans with students
- Make sure someone checks-in with students when they arrive at home

Did You Know?

Both Balmoral School and the Parent Advisory Council wrote letters of support to have a crosswalk installed to aid in students crossing 236 at Dykstra Rd / McKnight Rd.



In the morning, students should arrive no earlier than 8:20am. There is no supervision provided before this time on the playground.

It is important for families to share home time plans for students with the school. If there are changes families should be writing an agenda message, writing a note, emailing their teacher and the office, or phoning the office by 3pm.
