

Kindergarten-Grade 1 news:



The students were able to watch the incredible life cycle of Monarch Butterflies! While we missed out on the egg stage, the students were able to examine the other three stages the caterpillar (larvae), the chrysalis (pupa), and the adult butterfly. We waited patiently for the butterflies to emerge from the chrysalis stage, and cheered them on as they make their way all the way to Mexico for the winter.



Kindergarten-Grade 1 news:

The first month in Kindergarten/Grade 1 has been a great success! The students have done a great job learning all about the new routines, and discovering expected and unexpected behaviours at school. We have been sorting and counting objects in Math. The Kindergarten students are learning all about making repeating patterns, while the Grade 1s are learning about the core of a repeating pattern, how to extend them, and how to name a repeating pattern in different ways by using letters, words, or actions.

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The Grade 1s are learning about the 5 senses in Science. We decided to enjoy some of the beautiful September weather by going on a 5 senses nature walk.

learn.







September 27 we had our first hot lunch organized by Mrs. Schaeffer and helpers. Food was from the "Kiln" and it was delicious!
