#### Five Essential Components of Effective Reading Instruction

#### **PILLARS OF READING 5**

How can we teach all children to read accurately, rapidly, and with comprehension by the end of third grade? The National Reading Panel Report provides an answer to this question.

The National Reading Panel Report (National Institute of Child Health and Human Development [NICHD], 2000) summarized several decades of scientific research that clearly shows effective reading instruction addresses five critical areas:

- Phonemic awareness
- Phonics
- Fluency
- Vocabulary
- Comprehension

These five areas were incorporated into the No Child Left Behind Act and the Reading First initiative as essential components of effective reading instruction.

There are many approaches to teaching these five essential components. These approaches differ in how much guidance or direction teachers provide as their students are learning new skills, how clearly and directly teachers explain new skills, whether they demonstrate exactly how to use a specific skill, and whether the skills are taught in a thoughtful sequence. Scientific research reviewed by the National Reading Panel revealed that these different approaches or methods of teaching the five essential components are *not* equally effective. The most reliably effective approach is called *systematic and explicit instruction*.

### **Kindergarten - Grade 1**

T is for Tornado! This year in our Observation Station we are working on the ABCs of Science Experiments. These experiments not only appeal to the student's curiosity and inquisitive minds, but helps to strengthen their problem solving and analytical skills. The students were challenged to try to make their own twister and had a lot of fun doing so!

During the month of November, the Grade 1 students participated in November Numbers. November Numbers is dedicated to promoting a love of Math. We celebrated the number of the day by reading a Math story and then doing an exciting numerical activity to go along with the book. We will continue reading more Math stories until we have completed all 30 numbers.

After reading the story Benny's Pennies, the students came up with different ways to sort our pennies. Some of the ways we sorted the pennies included: heads or tails, American or Canadian, and shiny or not shiny. Next we filled in our ten frame page and counted to see how many pennies we had. We counted by 1s, 2s, 5s, and 10s to 100!

### **Kindergarten - Grade 1**

The Grade 1 students had an opportunity to design and build a shelter as part of their Science unit. Their shelters had to be made using a variety of materials, it had to withstand a cold Manitoba winter, it needed to be visually appealing, and it had to involve all of the five senses so that their shelter would be more comfortable and cozy for their animals. After presenting their shelters to the class, the students also got to share their projects with the 4/5 class.



## Grade 4/5

Our class has been learning about Habitats and Communities in science this term. They have conducted research to identify various carnivores, omnivores, and herbivores. We have discussed different predator and prey combinations. Students have learned about physical adaptations that animals take on in order to survive within their environment. Near the end of the month, students engaged in the design cycle to create a habitat of their choice!
