## **2023-2024 SCHOOL PLAN**

School Goal for LITERACY: To develop a school wide approach to structured literacy across kindergarten to grade 8.

School Goal for NUMERACY: To implement MRLC pacing guides in grades of grades 4-8 and to utilize thinking classroom strategies in the middle years' classrooms.

School Goal for WELL-BEING: To develop a school wide well-being curriculum plan across all grade levels. To implement self-regulation common strategies and practices in K-2 classrooms. To have staff engage in Indigenous Education professional development to increase Indigenous Education practices in the classroom.

### LITERACY STRATEGIES USED:

- Provided high quality structured literacy whole class and small group instruction and interventions (e.g., Tara West and UFLI programming and interventions).
- Revise and reworked home reading program based on structured literacy skills.
- Letters were sent home with Structured Literacy information for families at the beginning of the year.
- Assessed student literacy skills using Divisional assessment tools, and used the data to plan for instruction.
- Provided professional learning in ISD's structured literacy PLC for 3 teachers to build capacity for a Structured Literacy approach.
- Balmoral School Teacher PLC occurred during school-based admin/pd days and on MTS PD Day.
- ISD Literacy Support Teacher residency with K/1, 4/5, and 6/7 teachers.

## **NUMERACY STRATEGIES USED:**

Middle years teachers had the opportunity to collaboration with ISD's numeracy lead teacher on the implementation of the mRLC pacing guides.

Two teachers took part in ISD's professional learning as a part of the Thinking Classroom in Numeracy PLC.

Classroom furniture needs were assessed. Horseshoe tables and whiteboards were purchased to help build thinking classroom environments.


Thinking classroom strategies were showcased in the newsletter and during a PAC meeting where parents engaged in numeracy tasks on non-permanent vertical writing surfaces.
