

Three Stories Collides – Grade 7 & 8 Novel Study

Grade 7 & 8 ELA NEWS

As our part of our global quality of life and novel studies outcomes in ELA, the grade 7 & 8 took the adventure of reading the novel by Alan Gratz titled "Refugee". The novel follows the lives of three different young children who, although in different time periods, are forced from their homes due to conflict and war. The three stories told separately, have similar themes and connections, and mirrors many of the obstacles that each character faces to hopefully find safety and peace.


The students have been learning about human rights, and how conflict affect populations around the world. As an integrated unit between ELA and Social Studies the student divided into three different groups, each group taking one character and just reading about their story.

As they were reading the character's stories, they completed benchmark reports in the form of a digital journal or newspaper splash page to highlight the key part of the story. As well, to track the action from page to page, students made a chronological timeline of events.

Once all students have finished reading about their character's journey to freedom, students from each group met and collaborated to share and make connections between each of the characters. Students shared their timelines, compared news reports and shared insight to what they felt the character was experiencing.

All three stories were very impactful and students explored more of these stories when they visited the Canadian Museum of Human Rights on June 25th.
