


The next Balmoral Parent Advisory Council meeting is on **January 15, 2025 at 6 pm**. Everyone is welcome to attend.

Grade 6 to 8 Vimy Ridge Remembrance Day Project

As November 11th approached, the Grade 6 to 8 classes were busy researching and creating art pieces to honor the sacrifices of so many Canadian soldiers who fought through various conflicts around the world.

Students learned about the Battle of Vimy Ridge and how Canadian soldiers achieved victory in this pivotal battle, alongside the many lives that were lost. To commemorate this knowledge, students used oak leaves to create a silhouette of the fallen soldiers. Many may not know that the area around Vimy Ridge was lined with oak trees.

This knowledge of the oak trees led our class to another important story: the story of the Vimy Oaks. After the battle at Vimy, Lieutenant Leslie Miller from Scarborough, Ontario, serving with the Canadian Expeditionary Force, gathered a handful of acorns from a partially buried English oak on the ridge. He sent the acorns home to his family with instructions to plant them. In 1919, Lieutenant Miller returned to Canada, received a 25-acre section of his father's Scarborough farm, and transplanted the oaks along the border of his woodlot. He named his farm "The Vimy Oaks." Today, a number of these majestic oaks are thriving in the same spot.

In January 2014, a group of volunteers formed a non-profit organization with the goal of repatriating offspring of these descendant oaks back to Vimy Ridge, where the original oak trees had all been destroyed during the First World War. These saplings will be planted in the Vimy Foundation Centennial Park.

The story inspired us to create an informational pamphlet about Vimy Ridge and the significance of the Vimy Ridge Centennial Park. The students did an excellent job.

Grade 1 news:



A Treaty **medal** was given to the Chiefs at the time of Treaty signing.





The Grade 1 class has enjoyed working with the Grade 2/3 class on our Treaty ABC book. We learned that we are all Treaty people. One of our favourite activities was learning that M is for medal. First, we talked about how a medal was given to the Chiefs at the time of the Treaty signing. Next, we thought about the important people in our lives. We wrote about someone that we thought would earn a friendship medal and why they should get one. Finally, the students created their own friendship medals. We are looking forward to finding out what our next letter will teach us as we work our way through the alphabet.

Grade 7 Coding with Interactive Robots

Over the past few weeks, the students in the Grade 7 Graphic Communications class have been coding and designing different activities using two different tools.

The first tool was the Sphero robot, which can follow commands that the students design using block coding. The students utilized various commands to navigate the Sphero through a complex maze. They had to consider the speed of the Sphero, the friction needed to stop it, and the angles required to steer the Sphero through the numerous turns in the maze. The students enjoyed the challenge, and many were thrilled as they approached the finish line. Great job to everyone!





The second tool we used was Microbits. The Microbit is a computer chip that students can code to create games and conduct various simulations. The students really enjoyed programming these Microbits, and the two most popular designs were the games Rock, Paper, Scissors and Hot Potato. They had to use a variety of commands and different designs on the LED screen to communicate key instructions to their audience. The students challenged themselves and attempted many different activities.
